



# ***A Peaceful Village Community***

## **LOCATION**

Log Lane Village is well-connected. The Town in northeastern Colorado is nestled between Interstate Highway 76 and the South Platte River, only one mile from the Morgan County Seat, Fort Morgan. Denver is less than 80 miles west on I-76. More and more people are making their home in this Peaceful Village Community that features safe neighborhoods, quiet streets, and a family-oriented environment.

## **EDUCATION**

Log Lane students are bused one mile to attend schools in Fort Morgan. The Fort Morgan School District has an early childhood center, three elementary schools, a fifth/sixth grade school, one middle school and one high school. The total enrollment for the district is 2,970.

## **ATTRACTIONS**

Log Lane Village residents enjoy fishing at Boyd Ponds on the outskirts of the Town and a variety of water sports at Jackson Lake State Park, about 15 miles west on Colorado Highway 144. The Town also features a bicycling path, two parks, one church, and a community center that is used for parties, weddings, and reunions. Other amenities, such as the library and museum are nearby in Fort Morgan.

## **BUSINESS**

Employers in the community include M&S Electric, Fastenol Corporation, High Desert Construction, Schmeckle Brothers Construction, a service station, and an auto racing supply business. Many residents employed at major manufacturers in Fort Morgan.

## **HISTORY**

The Town of Log Lane Village was incorporated in 1956. Originally, according to ordinance, every structure was built with or sided with logs. The ordinance was dropped in the mid 1960's.
